# Managing WordPress is Hard: Debunking Common Myths

In the past, site builders were easy to build and maintain with a preformatted layout and tools like WordPress were scalable, but the WordPress classic editor had a significant learning curve. Today, WordPress offers the best of both worlds: developers and designers can customize it from the ground up, but business owners can update it day-to-day with ease.

**How? The Gutenberg Editor.** This cutting-edge drag-and-drop editor from WordPress makes editing your site a snap. Instead of writing in a big text field like a word processor, Gutenberg makes every element on your page a separate movable unit called a block—paragraph blocks, image blocks, video blocks, and much more.

Because the content is modular, you can easily rearrange content without breaking the layout and the backend of the site looks almost identical to the front-end, so you can see what visitors will view as you edit in real-time.
